Save More & Spend Less by Purchasing an ENERGY STAR Appliance in 2010

Beginning a new year always brings a resolve to save more and spend less, and that could be especially true during this difficult economy. Still, it's a resolution you can keep.

How? Replace one major home appliance with an ENERGY STAR appliance, and you can save up to \$75 this year on your energy bills. You may have heard that home appliances carry two price tags. The first is the price you pay to buy the appliance. The second is the amount you will pay every year over the life of the appliance for the energy and water needed to operate it. 5041401

ENERGY STAR appliances are designed to use 10 percent to 50 percent less energy and water than other models. The ENERGY STAR label is part of a U.S. government effort to encourage energy conservation. Though

ENERGY STAR appliances may cost a little more to buy than other models, you will reap the savings in operating

have earned the ENERGY STAR label. Another label to look for when you shop for a new appliance: the

yellow EnergyGuide. This label tells you how much energy the appliance uses every year and compares that number to similar models. The lower the operating cost, the more you'll save on your monthly energy bill.

In addition, Floridians purchasing ENERGY STAR appliances are eligible to receive rebates per House Bill 167. This bill enabled the Florida Energy and Climate Commission (FECC) to develop and manage guidelines, consistent with federal regulations, designating eligible appliances, rebate amounts and the process for issuing rebates.

The rebate program helps Floridians buy appliances at discount rates, lower utility costs, and benefits Florida



costs over the life of the appliance.

In accordance with Article IV, Section 5, of West Florida Electric Cooperative's bylaws, WFEC has appointed a nominating committee to identify interested and qualified members to be candidates for the board of trustees in the Co-op's upcoming elections. WFEC's members will elect trustees to represent the following districts:

District 1: That part of Calhoun County served by the cooperative.

District 2: That part of Jackson County lying east of the Chipola River and between the north line of Calhoun County and the south line of Township 6 North.

District 3: That part of Jackson County lying east of Marshall Creek, north of the south line of Township 6 North.

To be eligible to serve as a trustee, a person must be a bonafide WFEC member residing in the respective district and meet certain other requirements set forth in WFEC's bylaws. Desired qualifications include the ability to become bonded, the capability of receiving and sending electronic mail and facsimile transmissions and successfully meeting all requirements to become a National Rural Electric Cooperative Association Credentialed Cooperative Director within **36 months**. 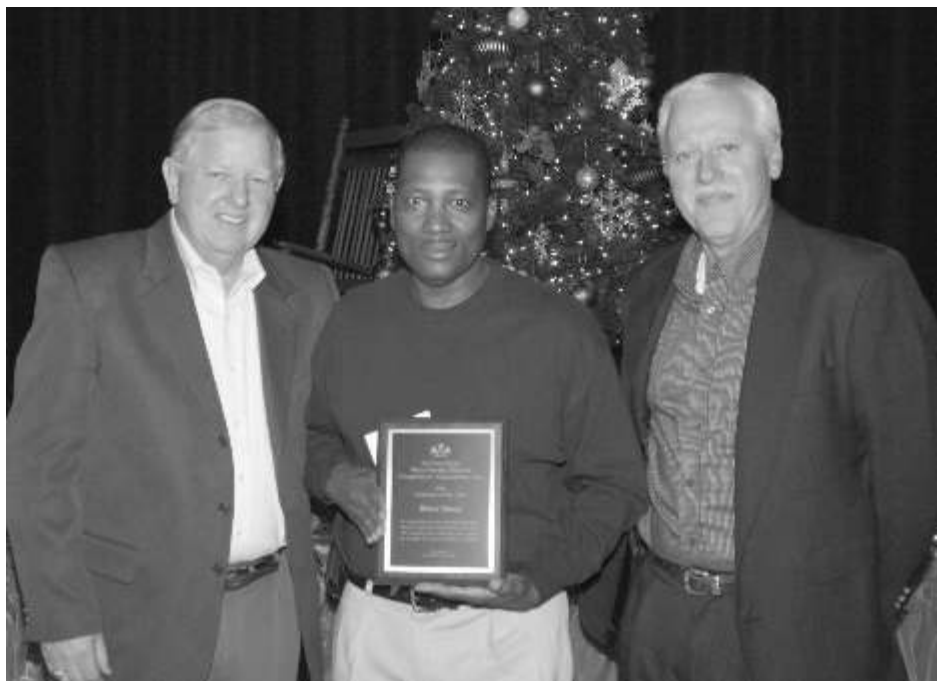



Programmable Thermostats Can Help Reduce Your Energy Bills

Properly using a programmable thermostat in your home is one of the easiest ways to save energy and money. An ENERGY STAR qualified programmable thermostat helps make it easy for you to save by offering pre-programmed settings to regulate your home's temperature in both summer and winter. Pre-programmed settings that come with ENERGY STAR qualified programmable thermostats are intended to deliver savings without sacrificing comfort. The key is to establish a program that automatically reduces heating and cooling in your home when you don't need as much.



How Do You Choose the Right One for You?

To decide which model is best for you, think about your schedule and how often you are away from home for regular periods of time and then decide which of the three different models best fits your schedule: the 7-day, 5+2-day, or the 5-1-1-day.

7-day models are best if your daily schedule tends to change. They offer the most flexibility, and allow you set different programs for different days — usually with four possible temperature periods per day.

5+2-day models use the same schedule every weekday, and another for weekends.

5-1-1 models are best if you tend to keep one schedule Monday through Friday and a different schedule on Saturday and Sunday.

Installation

Install your programmable thermostat unit on an interior wall, away from heating or cooling vents and other sources of heat or drafts (doorways, windows, skylights, direct sunlight or bright lamps). 5001602

Call a certified HVAC professional to ensure proper installation, as well as operation of your heating and cooling system. It's a good idea to upgrade an old manual thermostat to a programmable unit if you're replacing a heating & cooling system given that programmable thermostats are far more accurate and will maximize the efficiency of your new system. Heat pumps may require a special unit to maximize energy savings year-round. Talk to your retailer or HVAC contractor before selecting the thermostat.

Proper Use Guidelines for Programmable Thermostats

Through proper use of a programmable thermostat (using the 4 pre-programmed settings) you can save energy and money.

Rules of Thumb for Proper Use:


1. Keep the temperature set at its energy savings set-points for long periods of time (at least eight hours), for example, during the day, when no one is at home, and through the night, after bedtime.
2. All thermostats let you temporarily make an area warmer or cooler, without erasing the pre-set programming. This override is cancelled automatically at the next program period. You use more energy (and end up paying more on energy bills) if you consistently "hold" or over-ride the pre-programmed settings.
3. Units typically have 2 types of hold features:
(a) hold/permanent/vacation; (b) temporary. Avoid using the hold/permanent/vacation feature to manage day to day temperature settings. "Hold" or "vacation" features are best when you're planning to be away for an extended period. Set this feature at a constant, efficient temperature (i.e. several degrees warmer temperature in summer, several degrees cooler during winter), when going away for the weekend or on vacation. You'll waste energy and money if you leave the "hold" feature at the comfort setting while you're away. 8450201
4. Cranking your unit up to 90 degrees or down to 40 degrees will not heat or cool your house any faster. Most thermostats, including

ENERGY STAR qualified units, begin to heat or cool at a set time, to reach the set temperatures sometime thereafter. Units with adaptive (smart/intelligent) recovery features are an exception to this rule — adaptive recovery units are constantly calculating the amount of time required to heat or cool the house, so that it reaches that temperature when the homeowner programmed it. By "examining" the performance of the past few days the thermostat can keep track of the seasons. In this way, your house is always at the comfort levels when occupied, but saving the most energy when unoccupied.

5. Many homes use just one thermostat to control the whole house. If your home has multiple heating or cooling zones, you'll need a programmed setback thermostat for each zone to maximize comfort, convenience and energy savings throughout the house.
6. If your programmable thermostat runs on batteries, don't forget to change the batteries each year. Some units will indicate when batteries should be changed.

Save with Your Manual Thermostat

You can still make the most of your manual thermostat by adjusting the temperatures daily before you leave the house and when you go to sleep at night. Typically, adjusting temperatures 5–8 degrees (down in winter, up in summer) can help save energy if you're going to be away from home for several hours.

Exploring Alabama's Quail Trail

At some point, each hiker and hunter has experienced the heart-stopping surprise of having a covey of quail explode from under their feet. For years, Alabama's wild coveys of bobwhite quail dotted just about every farm and forest property throughout the state. Then, for reasons that continue to be studied, the



bobwhite quail entered a spiraling decline. Change and loss of habitat for the quail ranks at the top of a long list of suspected and investigated causes. Since so much of the quail's primary habitat relies on private lands, an organization was formed to reach out to these property owners. The hopes of organizing an Alabama Quail Trail were to re-establish a trail of viable quail hunting venues throughout the state.

The Alabama Quail Trail has a three-fold mission for the sport of quail hunting. First, of course, is to market the state's replenished and excellent supply of quail hunting. The trail provides a method for plantations to generate revenue and participate in a statewide marketing plan.

Second is to continue with the valuable research for habitat development, nesting sites, and natural cover as part of the plan for successful quail restoration and preservation.

Third is the creation of a network that matches technical assistance and incentives for private lands. This assistance helps to provide the necessary habitat for increasing wild quail numbers and developing more opportunities for quail related

businesses in rural areas.

There are now more than 40 sites across the state, which are currently recognized as participants of the Alabama Quail Trail. Properties are being added as they join in the commitment to promote the sport of quail hunting and practice the conservation efforts required to sustain it. 8950001

With over 40 different scenarios of bird hunting, wing shooters get to experience a tremendous diversity of terrain in Alabama. From the rocky hills north of Birmingham, to the wetland areas of Baldwin County, the Alabama Quail Trail exposes the upland wing shooter to an endless variety of hunting situations. For the serious quail hunter, a location for flushing the prized bird can easily be found within driving distance.

In the state of Alabama, most of the premier quail habitat is held by private landowners. Assistance in managing these lands for quail is essential for enhancing and sustaining populations of the bobwhite quail. Many of the current Quail Trail properties were already participating in a variety of hunting and wildlife management programs. The addition of quail

management only worked to enhance the property's offering as a well-rounded wildlife habitat.

A partnership was formed between the Alabama Forestry Commission, Alabama TREASURE Forest Association, Alabama Wildlife Federation, The Longleaf Alliance, and the U.S. Forest Service. A host of other conservation minded supporters have also entered the scene.

These partners are committed to working with landowners to improve their property's quail habitat and enhance the stewardship of natural resources. Since every piece of land is different, there is no "cookie-cutter" recipe for managing a balanced quail habitat.

This program offers landowners an opportunity to work with professional wildlife biologists in developing a specific strategy to improve quail habitat on their property. The hopes are that in doing so, these properties will provide plenty of quail and quail hunting to sustain the future of the sport.

Future generations of hunters will approach the sport of upland bird hunting with an entirely different

understanding of Alabama's quail, than what was experienced by their grandparents.

Shooting quail over trained dogs is a long standing and treasured heritage in the state of Alabama. The interest of preserving that heritage has certainly gained support from a variety of sources. Those who have the passion for this sport have come to realize that it is something that needs to be protected and grown. More importantly, quail hunting is definitely a sport to be shared with others. 5209302

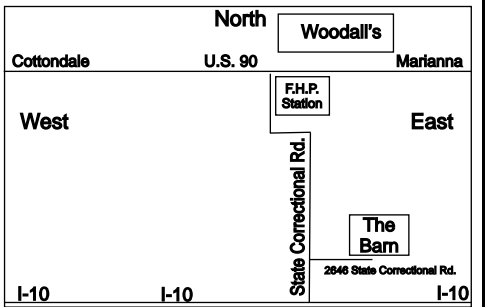

- 2/3 cup sugar
- 2 (.25 ounce) envelopes Fleischmann's® RapidRise Yeast
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 cup water

Board to Appoint District 9 Trustee

In accordance with the cooperative's bylaws and board policy 113, West Florida Electric's Board of Trustees has appointed a search committee to begin the process of filling the District 9 position recently vacated by the passing of long time trustee Mr. Henry Prescott.

The Board of Trustees will entertain applications from qualified individuals residing in District 9 who meet the criteria for serving as a trustee as outlined in the cooperatives bylaws.

West Florida Electric Trustee qualifications: WFEC Bylaws Article IV Section 2.

1. Must be a member of the cooperative.
2. Must be a bonafide resident of the district.
3. May not be employed by or financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business selling electric energy or supplies; or in a business primarily engaged in selling electrical or plumbing appliances, fixtures, or supplies to the members.
4. May not have been an employee of the cooperative within 3 years or is a spouse, parent, child or sibling of a person who has.
5. May not have been found guilty of a felony, regardless of whether adjudication was withheld or found guilty of a misdemeanor involving the illegal possession, sale or use of a controlled substance.

In addition the WFEC trustees have established a set of minimum qualifications for consideration of an appointment as follows:

1. Trustees should be capable of receiving electronic mail.

2. Trustees should make every attempt to become a Cooperative Certified Director within a three year period.

3. Trustees should make themselves available to the cooperative a minimum of 24 days per year. These days include regular and special meetings of the board, committee meetings, association meetings and trustee training classes.

Persons interested in being considered for this position should pick up an application packet at the Graceville office Monday-Friday from 9:00 AM till 4:00 PM.

District 9 encompasses that part of Holmes County lying west of the Choctawhatchee River. The trustees have adopted a timeline and schedule for this appointment process as follows:

February 5: Announcement of Vacancy

February 5-19: Applications for appointment may be picked up at WFEC's Graceville office.

February 19: Application deadline; 12:00 Noon

February 19-23: Search Committee Application Review

February 24: Candidate Interviews

February 25: Board meeting and appointment

The search committee will review applications and select the top 5 candidates to interview. All candidate interviews will take place on February 24 from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. All applicants must be available for interviews on this date. The committee will rank the candidates and the top three candidates will be submitted to the board on February 25th. The board at its discretion may request a second interview with the top candidate on Feb 25th at 3:00 PM.
